### **OUR FOCUS**





# MAKING BENEFICIAL LIFESTYLE CHOICES

o combat the problem of obesity in Warren County, our Family and Consumer Sciences agent offered an eight-week program utilizing the University of Kentucky's "Weight, The Reality Series" curriculum. Thirteen adult participants attended a weekly night class that included a demonstration of a healthy recipe and some form of physical activity. A nutrition-related presentation was also given. Participants began the class by privately measuring their waistlines, weighing in and recording their information in a personal folder. They also had many oppor-

tunities to share their successes through the program and build a support system that helped individuals reach their goals. At the end of the journey, the group was 69 pounds lighter and had lost 28.5 inches off of their waistlines.1





#### **OUR COMMUNITY**

► Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In August 2009, the rate of unemployment in Warren County was 11.1%.3

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community wellbeing. In Warren

## As a result of participation in Warren County Extension programs:


- 306 people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- 105 people increased their knowledge of governmental process.
- 280 people expanded their knowledge of economic development.

County, **2.38%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and 60-day bank card delinquency rates have increased by **1.83%**.<sup>4</sup> In a one-year period (October 2008 through October 2009), **353** foreclosures were filed.<sup>5</sup>

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Warren County, **13%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.<sup>6</sup>

### **OUR HEALTH**

► The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Warren County. Figure 2. Health Risks.<sup>6</sup>




### As a result of participation in Warren County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- 1,259 people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **380** people increase knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- 1,467 people implemented practices to maintain health and well-being.

#### **OUR FAMILIES**

- ► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Warren County families can be described as follows:<sup>2</sup>
- 23,427 families reside in the county.
- 2,559 families (10.8%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is \$45,142.
- **878** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **5,625** people in Warren County receive food stamps. The average family food stamp benefit is **\$220.04** per month.<sup>7</sup>

In the county, **319** children live in out-of-home care.<sup>8</sup>

In 2005, there were **490** incidents of adult abuse and **449** incidents of child abuse.<sup>9</sup>

### As a result of participation in Warren County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- 2,833 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- 2,610 people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- 102 people increased their knowledge and skills related to parenting and personal relationships.
