Green Living and Zero Waste



Zero Waste is the conservation of resources by means of responsible production, consumption, reuse, and recovery of products, packaging, and materials without burning, and with no discharges to land, water, or air that threaten the environment or human health. There are five ways we can all make a difference in regard to waste: refusing what we don't need, reducing what we do need, reusing things we have, recycling what we can, and composing the rest. Leading up to Earth Day, Taylor County's FCS Extension agent taught multiple lessons on Zero Waste and how to make beeswax food wraps, an alternative to plastic wrap. As a result, people are buying less plastic and, in turn, decreasing the amount of trash they are producing.
