Money Habitudes helps evaluate spending habits



Each year the Nicholas County Family and Consumer Sciences
Extension agent has the opportunity to work with the FRSKY Angel
Tree program to provide educational workshops. This year, we
provided the Money Habitudes workshop. This program combines
the focus of money habits and attitudes with a fun card game
highlighting individual spending habits. The goal is to take a closer
look at how you spend your money to evaluate whether that lines
up best with your current money goals. Eleven participants worked
through their money habitudes this year. Of those participants, 81%
felt like their habitudes accurately described them. All participants
made it their goal to be more aware of where they are spending their
money so they can make better financial decisions.
