Are you expecting?

Warm up:

Start with these moves to get your body ready.

- Standing arm circles – 30 seconds
- March in place – 1 minute
- Standing arm circles (reverse direction) – 30 seconds
- March in place – 1 minute

Workout:

Complete the following lower body movements, resting as needed.

- Squats (x30)
- Heel Raises (x30)
- Lunges (x30)
- Wall Sit (30 seconds)
- Squats (x30)
- Heel Raises (x30)
- Lunges (x30)
- Wall Sit (30 seconds)
